Lecture	The concept of business activity and the forms of conducting it. The principles of economic liability of entrepreneurs. Commercial law companies. The contracts made in business activities of enterprises. Securities. Economic disputes and settlement methods.
Classes	The concept of business activity and the forms of conducting it – analysis of regulations. The principles of economic responsibility of entrepreneurs – analysis of regulations. Commercial law companies - analysis of regulations. Contracts made in business activity of entrepreneurs – drafting contracts in business transactions (sale contract, supply contract, contract for a specific task, lease contract, tenancy contract, leasing contract, etc.). Economic disputes and settlement methods – drafting a settlement agreement, a lawsuit and a response to a lawsuit in business transactions.
