Boosting self-confidence and dealing with fears and beliefs that undermine learn- ing outcomes. Methods and techniques of organising time and space.
other	 Mind maps - note-taking, self-study, conceptual work, organising data, repetition, making presentations. Basic principles of memory work and personal bookmarks. How to remember specialised vocabulary and foreign words - the Substitute Word Technique. The Chain of Associations Method - memory and creativity. Number Bookmarks - memorising dates, ranked lists of terms. Major Memory System and Phonetic Digital Alphabet - memorising long numbers, river lengths, elevation.
